

G503 WWII Jeep Installing Front Brake Drum

This article shows the steps for Installing the WWII Jeep Front Brake Drum



Assuming that you have removed your Front Brake Drum already, we now want to replace it. Before you begin, it is recommended to Pack your Bearings. You should be ready with to install your drum over the brake pads



If you are re-installing the front brake drum, the back side of your drum should have some components already installed as shown here, if not consult the TM-1513 and install them. It is a good idea, to remove these items and re-pack your bearings while your drum is off.

Assuming your are ready to re-install, push your Front drum carefully over the axle shaft and over the brake pads. You should feel the drum move all the way back on the axle over the brake shoes.



Next, install your cone bearings with the pointy end first (see diagram above). Push them all the way back into the drum.







Press the flange all the way back and install the flange bolts.
Next install the axle shaft/flange washer
Then install the axle shaft/flange castle nut. The castle nut should tighten down past the hole for the cotter pin, to to far.
Bend the cotter pin around the axle shaft nut as shown.

Next, slap on the cap and your done!
